### Andrew L. Warshaw

Dr. Andrew Warshaw, a graduate of Harvard College and of Harvard Medical School, trained in surgery at Massachusetts General Hospital and in gastroenterology at the National Institutes of Health. Continuously on the faculty of Harvard Medical School since 1972, he chaired the MGH Department of Surgery from 1997 – 2011. Dr. Warshaw has been President of many professional organizations. He was a Director of the American Board of Surgery and its Chairman in 1993. He conceived the volunteerism program of the American College of Surgeons, Operation Giving Back. In 1999, he founded the Political Action Committee of the American College of Surgeons, and in 2007, he was appointed Chair of its Health Policy and Advocacy Group. Dr. Warshaw has made important contributions to the understanding of inflammatory and malignant lesions of the pancreas. His bibliography lists more than 430 original reports as well as 240 book chapters and reviews, and 13 books. He was Editor-in chief of SURGERY from 1997 – 2015. He has received the Master Educator Award of the Society for Surgery of the Alimentary Tract, the Lifetime Achievement Award of the American Pancreatic Association, the Founders Medal of the Society for Surgery of the Alimentary Tract, and the James Ewing Medal of the Society of Surgical Oncology. Harvard Medical School has given him the Joseph B. Martin Dean's Award for Advancement of Women and the Harold Amos Faculty Diversity Award.
